Notice of Endangered Status

Pension Plan for Hospital and Health Care Employees – Philadelphia and Vicinity

This is to inform you that on March 28, 2014 the plan actuary certified to the U.S. Department of the Treasury, and also to the plan sponsor, that the Pension Plan for Hospital and Health Care Employees – Philadelphia and Vicinity (the "Plan") is in endangered status for the plan year beginning January 1, 2014. Federal law requires that you receive this notice.

Endangered Status

The Plan is considered to be in endangered status because the Plan's actuary has determined that the funded percentage of the Plan is less than 80% for the plan year beginning January 1, 2014. The funded percentage as of January 1, 2014 for certification purposes is 72.35%.

Funding Improvement Plan

Federal law requires pension plans in endangered status to adopt a funding improvement plan aimed at restoring the financial health of the plan. This is the second year the Plan has been in endangered status. The Board of Trustees of the Plan (the "Trustees") approved a Funding Improvement Plan on June 19, 2013. As part of the Funding Improvement Plan, the funded percentage of the Plan must be increased by one-third within the ten-year funding improvement period from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2025. As required by law, the Trustees will review the Funding Improvement Plan annually and make changes as necessary.
